20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Council was established by Section 3092 (a)(6) of Public Law 113-291, and in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act, as amended, 5 U.S.C. Ch. 10. The Council advises the Secretary of the Interior with respect to the preparation and implementation of the management plan.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

As described by the establishing legislation, the Council shall consist of 10 members, to be appointed by the Secretary, of whom: a. One member shall be a member of, or be nominated by, the County Commission; b. One member shall be a member of, or be nominated by, the city council of Las Vegas, Nevada; c. One member shall be a member of, or be nominated by, the city council of North Las Vegas, Nevada; d. One member shall be a member of, or be nominated by, the Las Vegas Paiute Tribe; e. One member shall be a representative of the conservation community in southern Nevada; f. One member shall be a representative of Nellis Air Force Base; g. One member shall be nominated by the State; h. One member shall reside in the County and have a background that reflects the purpose for which the Monument was established; and i. Two members shall reside in the County or adjacent counties, both of whom shall have experience in the field of paleontology, obtained through higher education, experience, or both.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Council will meet approximately 2-4 times annually, and at such times as designated by the DFO. One meeting was held in FY 2024, March 06, 2024.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Qualified advice concerning issues that affect a wide array of subjects from those of local property owners to those that affect town, county, and state interests can only be attained from individuals who

possess fundamental knowledge, understanding, and interest in those areas.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings are open to the public.

Effective January 7, 2025, the Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument Advisory Council is administratively inactive.

The Council discussed the General Managment Plan; made no new recommendations in 2024. The Council made 2 recommendations in 2023: 1- Work toward minimizing impacts to the monument by the GreenLink West transmission line project. 2 - AC members expressed strongly to have a more substantial role in the General Management Plan process. It fits their role as articulated in the legislation for the monument's establishment.

The agency believed that the establishment of a Visitor Experience Subcommittee was premature in 2016 but has been reconsidered in FY 2023. TUSK has begun collecting visitor use data that is showing what types of recreation are occurring at the monument. A subcommittee may be established to gather info through the tourism industry to determine what experiences are lacking in the LV valley or which ones we haven't thought of yet. The GMP kicked off in July 2021.
