20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Section 402(b)(9) of the Public Health Service Act states that "the Director, NIH...shall assure that research at the National Institutes of Health is subject to review in accordance with section 492. Section 492(b) states that the Director of NIH shall establish procedures for periodic technical and scientific peer review of research at the National Institutes of Health. This Board assesses the quality of the Institute's Intramural Research Program (IRP) and evaluates the productivity and performance of staff scientists, necessary functions for the operation of a highly effective intramural research program. The Board is composed of scientific and technical experts. The Board continues to provide indispensable

evaluations and advice in the scientific management of IRP. In addition to the peer review of each laboratory, the Chair and individual members of the Board are frequently consulted for advice on program development and staff appointments. The Board's crucial role is assuring the continued high quality of NIA intramural research and this was demonstrated by the reviews held during the past year. In October 2022, no labs or PIs were reviewed, only two concepts were reviewed. In May 2023 the Laboratory of Clinical Investigation (LCI), Off-Cycle Tenure Tracks, and Alzheimer's Disease (AD) Concept were reviewed.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Board will consist of fourteen members, approximately, including the Chair, appointed by the Director, NIH, from authorities knowledgeable in the fields of basic and clinical sciences related to the research activities of the Institute.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Meetings are generally held twice a year. In FY 2023, meetings were held in October 2022 and May 2023.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Board is composed of recognized biomedical research authorities from outside the NIH in order to secure unbiased and objective evaluation of intramural research programs. Their recommendations are invaluable because the complex nature of research in each laboratory requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from

other established resources.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the Board were partially closed for the review, discussion, and evaluation of individual programs and projects conducted by the Institute, including consideration of personnel qualifications and performance, the competence of individual investigators and other similar items. Section 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permits the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

21. Remarks

Committee Function: Other - Scientific and Technical Peer Review. Reports: This committee did not produce any public reports during the fiscal year. DFO/Committee Decision Maker: Based on the assignment of responsibilities in this Institute, the roles of the committee's designated federal officer and the committee decision maker are held by the same individual. Andrea LaCroix continues to serve as Chair. Her term ends 6/30/2024. Terrie Moffit's term start was incorrectly listed in the 2022 ACR as 3/13/2022.
