20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

During FY25, the Board met twice. The Board received updates on institutional affairs to include the Superintendent's vision for the academy, morale and discipline, curriculum, instruction, physical equipment, fiscal affairs, academic methods, as well as various requested topics by the Board.

20b. How does the Committee balance its

membership?

Board membership is presently composed of six (6) Presidential Appointees, six (6) Senators, and seven (7) Congressional Representatives, for a current total of 16. The United States Naval Academy (USNA) Board of Visitors (BoV) Charter does not place a cap on the number of total members, but requires a minimum of 15 members to be seated. The Presidential Appointees represent a blend of wealth of knowledge and experience in the private sector, military, and government service. Congressional members serve in a variety of critical committees, including the Armed Services Committee and the Appropriations Committee.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Under the provisions of Title 10, United States Code (U.S.C.) Sec. 8468, the BoV visits the USNA annually. The Board had decided to hold 2 meetings this year. During FY25, the board met twice in person: 5 May 2025 and 8 September 2025.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Federal statute (Title 10, U.S.C. Sec. 8468) requires the Secretary of Defense to establish this committee.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the Department of Defense (DoD) determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions of Title 5, U.S.C., Sec. 552b(c). Pursuant to DoD policy, closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor, the

Secretary of the Navy, or designee, and only after consultation with the Office of the Secretary of the Navy General Counsel.
