20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Federal Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice (FACJJ) provides advice and guidance in accordance with its charter and bylaws and the JJDP Act to the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) Administrator, the President, and the Congress.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The FACJJ is composed of no more than 56 member representatives of the State Advisory Groups appointed under the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, 42 U.S.C. 5633(a)(3). No member may serve more than two-year terms (four years total) on the FACJJ (including any successor advisory committee formed pursuant to Title II of the Act), except as specified in the By-Laws of the FACJJ.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee meets at least twice a year and typically up to four times a year. Generally, one or two in-person and one or two webinar meeting are convened to carry out the duties identified in the charter and otherwise as required. In addition, three to four subcommittees convene teleconferences to support the activities of the FACJJ. Subcommittees meet telephonically on a monthly basis.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Section 241(f) of the JJDP Act mandates that the Administrator of OJJDP provide funds for this committee. In accordance with the JJDP Act, the FACJJ plays a critical role in ensuring that OJJDP, the Congress, and the President are aware of state concerns pertinent to juvenile justice and related issues.
