20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Panel, pursuant to section 813(b)(1) of the FY 2016 NDAA, shall provide to the Secretary of Defense and the Deputy Secretary of Defense, through the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics (USD(AT&L)), a review of 10 U.S.C. §§ 2320 and

2321, regarding rights in technical data and the validation of proprietary data restrictions and the regulations implementing such sections, for the purpose of ensuring that such statutory and regulatory requirements are best structured to serve the interests of the taxpayers and the national defense.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Panel shall be composed of no more than 20 members. Pursuant to section 813(b)(2) of the FY 2016 NDAA, Panel members selected from the Federal government will be knowledgeable about technical data issues and appropriately represent the three military departments, as well as the legal, acquisition, logistics, and research and development communities in the Department of Defense; and Panel members selected from the private sector will include independent experts and individuals appropriately representative of the diversity of interested parties, including large and small businesses, traditional and nontraditional government contractors, prime contractors and subcontractors, suppliers of hardware and software, and institutions of higher education.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee will meet at a minimum of once per year.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Secretary of Defense, pursuant to section 813(b)(1) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2016 (FY 2016 NDAA) (Public Law 114-92) and in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) of 1972 (5 U.S.C., Appendix, as amended) and 41 C.F.R. § 102-3.50(a), established this non-discretionary Panel.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the Department of Defense determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions of 5 U.S.C.§552b(c). Pursuant to DoD Policy, closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor, the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics, and in consultation with the Office of General Counsel for the Department of Defense.

21. Remarks

This discretionary advisory committee, the Government-Industry Advisory Panel was terminated by the Department of Defense (DoD) prior to the signing of Executive Order (EO) 13875, "Evaluating and Improving the Utility of Federal Advisory Committees", dated June 14, 2019. Notwithstanding, the DoD in accordance with EO 13875 and OMB guidance included this discretionary advisory committee as part of DoD's 1/3 reduction in discretionary advisory committees which was directed by EO 13875.
