The Committee also provides advice considerate of impacts imposed upon industry from possible operational or policy changes.

Committee membership is composed of agencies and businesses from the travel industry. Represented are national and international travel industry organizations, large airport facilities, and businesses representing the largest airlines and cruise companies.

There were no public meetings during FY 22 and FY23. The Committee generally meets at least once a year. The meetings provide a forum for the industry to voice concerns and give recommendations to CBP and gives the agency an opportunity to report on progress achieved since the last meeting.

The Committee serves to focus attention on those areas of most concern and benefit to both the travel industry and the federal government. It provides the travel industry and other interested parties a forum to discuss current inspection programs and fees.
