Members include individuals with a demonstrated interest in the civil rights issues of color, race, religion, gender, age, disability, national origin, and voting rights. Membership is fairly balanced in terms of the points of view represented and the functions to be performed, and both major political parties are represented.

Depending upon resources, Advisory Committees are encouraged to meet at least four times each year and more often, if possible.

# 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?
