Membership is comprised of members reflecting broad scientific disciplines within the scientific community, academia and private enterprise.

During this reporting period, the Census Scientific Advisory Committee met two (2) times this fiscal year (Mar. 14-15, 2024, Sept. 19-20, 2024). Agenda topics reflect timely concerns that are relevant and require external expert feedback for the Census Bureau's consideration.

The Committee provides a broader level of technical and scientific expertise to address emerging program challenges and needs.
