20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Board advises the Secretary of Commerce on government policies and programs that affect the U.S. travel and tourism industry, including ways to ensure the United States remains competitive in travel and tourism. To accomplish this purpose, the TTAB provides consensus letters of recommendation several times throughout the term on topics asked for by the Secretary. The TTAB meets regularly throughout the term, both in

working groups and as a whole, to determine these recommendations and ensure that industry input in accurately and appropriate reflected. In FY24, the TTAB provided three letters of recommendation to the Secretary to accomplish its purpose.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Members represent companies and organizations in the travel and tourism sector from a broad range of products and services, company sizes and geographic locations, and drew from large, medium and small travel and tourism companies, private-sector organizations involved in the export of travel and tourism-related products and services, and other tourism-related entities. The board in FY 24 included destinations from across the country (LA, Puerto Rico, Maryland); hotels; a labor union; online travel agencies; diverse and accessible organizations; attractions; a tour operator; and more. In this way, the TTAB in FY 24 was able to compile a variety of points of view that were balanced across the 32 members.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Per the TTAB charter, the TTAB meets at a minimum of two times per year. The TTAB did meet two time in FY24 - in December 2023 and June 2024. There were also two meetings on the margins o FY24 - one in September 2023 and one in October 2024; but these were not technically in FY24 and are therefore not reflected in the annual review.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This Committee is essential to advise the

Secretary on promotion activities as directed by P.L. 108-7, Section 10 and to achieve the broader function of the charter of this discretionary committee. Although the Secretary can meet with individual travel and tourism companies, there is no other body which can provide this type of consensus advice on travel and tourism to the Secretary. This remained true in FY24.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings? All meetings are open to the public.
