The Board acts as a liaison to the stakeholders represented by the membership, consulting with them on emerging issues in the industry to support sustainable travel and tourism growth, and providing a forum for discussing and proposing solutions to industry-related problems.

# 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Members represent companies and organizations in the travel and tourism sector from a broad

range of products and services, company sizes and geographic locations, and drew from large, medium and small travel and tourism companies, private-sector organizations involved in the export of travel and tourism-related products and services, and other tourism-related entities. The diverse membership of the Board assures perspectives reflecting the breadth of the Board's responsibilities, and, where possible, the Department of Commerce will also consider the ethnic, racial, and gender diversity and various abilities of the United States population.

## 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Meetings take place at least four times annually. Meetings are called when the Secretary would like to ask the TTAB for recommendations in certain areas, or when the TTAB needs to vote to approve draft recommendations.

## 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This Committee is essential to advise the Secretary on promotion activities as directed by P.L. 108-7, Section 10 and to achieve the broader function of the charter of this discretionary committee. There is no other body which can provide this advice to the Secretary.
