20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Committee acts in the public interest to assess: (1) trends and developments in the science and engineering of earthquake hazards reduction; (2) effectiveness of the Program in carrying out the activities under section 103(a)(2) of the Earthquake Hazards Reduction Act of 1977; (3) the need to revise the Program; and (4) the coordination, implementation, and activities of the Program.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Members are selected on the basis of established records of distinguished service in their professional community and their knowledge of issues affecting the Program. Members reflect the wide diversity of technical disciplines, competencies, and communities involved in earthquake hazards reduction. Members are drawn from industry and other communities having an active interest in the Program, such as, but not limited to, research and academic institutions, industry standards development organizations, state, local, tribal, and territorial governments, and financial communities, who are qualified to provide advice on earthquake hazards reduction and represent all related scientific, architectural, social, and engineering disciplines. The diverse membership of the Committee assures expertise reflecting the breadth of the Committee's responsibilities, and, where possible, DOC will also consider the ethnic, racial, and gender diversity.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee meets face-to-face at least once per year to receive agency activity updates in a timely and efficient manner relevant to the National Earthquake Hazards Reduction Program (NEHRP). Additional meetings may be called whenever requested by the DFO or the NIST Director. To promote timely meetings and efficient spending, as directed by Executive Order 13589, the Committee conducts webinars in lieu of face-to-face meetings.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Committee is necessary to fulfill the responsibility of the Department under the National Earthquake Hazards Reduction Program Reauthorization Act of 2004 (42 U.S.C. §§ 7701 et seq.), which was amended in December 2018.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

21. Remarks

This Committee functions solely as an advisory body, in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act. The appointed Committee Chair is following the minimum requirements of the current ACEHR Charter by submitting a full report to the Director of NIST at least once every two years on its findings of the assessment carried out under the objective and scope of activities within the charter, and its recommendations for ways to improve the Program. No changes in the total number of recommendations since the last Committee biennial report was submitted on September 30,

2023 and the next report won't be submitted until September 30, 2025. Changes in Membership: David Cocke, whose first term appointment was due to expire on October 31, 2024, was appointed by the NIST Director to serve a second consecutive three-year term ending 10/31/2027. Ellen Rathje resigned from her ACEHR appointment on June 20, 2024 due to other work and outside commitments.

The Committee is mandated by P.L. 115-307, the 2018 reauthorization of the National Earthquake Hazards Reduction Program (NEHRP). By statute, the Committee is composed of representatives of research & academic institutions, industry standards development organizations, state & local government, & financial committees who are qualified to provide advice on earthquake hazards reduction & represent all related scientific, architectural, & engineering disciplines. The Committee shall assess trends and developments in the science & engineering of earthquake hazards reduction; effectiveness of the program in carrying out its prescribed activities; need to revise the program; and the management, coordination, implementation, and activities of NEHRP.

Number of Recommendations Comments

There were no new recommendations in FY24. Out of the 116 recommendations, 54% (was 52%) are "fully implemented", 16% (was 15%) are "partially implemented", 6% (was 7%) are "in planning", 9% (was 11%) are "under consideration", and 11% are considered "out of scope". Based on legislative changes by the NEHRP Reauthorization Act of 2018, 4% are considered "not applicable".

What is the approximate Percentage of these recommendations that have been or will be Fully implemented by the agency?

% of Recommendations Fully Implemented Comments

This approximate percentage of fully implemented recommendations increased by 2% since FY23. NEHRP is a multi-agency program; therefore, many of the recommendations are tied to funding issues that are governed by appropriations, legislation, and available resources, which can be different for each of the NEHRP agencies. Consistent with available resources, each recommendation is being addressed.

What is the approximate <u>Percentage</u> of these recommendations that have been or will be <u>Partially</u> implemented by the agency?
