20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Board, through the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy (USD(P)), shall provide the Secretary of Defense and the Deputy Secretary of Defense, independent advice and recommendations on matters concerning defense policy in response to specific tasks from the Secretary of Defense, the Deputy Secretary of Defense, or the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy and shall focus on: (a) issues central to strategic Department of Defense (DoD) planning; (b) policy implications of U.S. force structure and force modernization on DoD's ability to execute U.S. defense strategy; (c) U.S. regional defense policies; and (d) any other topics raised by the Secretary of Defense, the Deputy Secretary of Defense, or the USD(P).

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The DoD, in selecting potential candidates for the Board, reviews the educational and professional credentials of individuals with extensive professional experience in the areas of defense and national security affairs. Membership is diverse and not static.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The DPB shall meet at the call of the DPB's DFO, in consultation with the DPB's Chair and the USD(P). The estimated number of DPB meetings is three to four per year. The Secretary of Defense's continued personal interest in and appreciation of the Board's advice is demonstrated by his personal meetings with the Board's full membership and frequent informal discussions with the Board Chair concerning topics for future study.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Secretary of Defense has determined that the independent advice provided by the Defense Policy Board on a wide range of geo-political and national security issues concerning the DoD cannot be obtained from any other DoD advisory committee.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the Department of Defense determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions of title 5 U.S.C.§552b(c). Pursuant to DoD policy, closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor, the Under

Secretary of Defense for Policy or designee, and only after consultation with the Office of General Counsel for the Department of Defense.

21. Remarks

The committee does not publish separate reports. Nina Hachigian resigned her membership August 8, 2022, but it was not reflected in the FY22 ACR. The Honorable Ashton Carter passed away on October 24, 2022.
