The Committee has a balanced membership, by considering such factors as geography, technical expertise, community involvement, and knowledge of programs and/or activities related to BEA ACM. Individuals will be selected based on their expertise or experience in specific areas as needed by BEA ACM. The diverse membership of the Committee assures expertise reflecting the full breadth of the Committee's responsibilities, and, where possible, the Department of Commerce will also consider the ethnic, racial, and gender diversity and various abilities of the United States population.

The Advisory Committee is essential to ensure that the Federal Government's GDP statistics meet the standards set by leaders in the fields of economics, business research, and business
