20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The TIP Advisory Board will accomplish its purpose through providing the TIP Director with advice on programs, plans and policies of TIP; reviews TIP's efforts to accelerate R&D of challenging, high-risk, high-reward technologies in areas of critical national need; reports on the general health of the program and its effectiveness, and provides guidance on appropriate investment areas. The TIP Advisory Board provides an annual report to Congress.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

By statute, the TIP Advisory Board consists of 10 members, at least 7 of which shall be from United

States industry. None may be Federal employees. The 7 industrial members are chosen to reflect the wide diversity of technical disciplines represented in TIP projects.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Beginning with the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act, 2012, which was the 2012 Appropriations Bill for NIST, funding was discontinued for the Technology Innovation Program (TIP) resulting in all of its operations including the TIP Advisory Board to be terminated by September 30, 2012. This committee is now administratively inactive until or unless future funding is provided.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

TIP was created to assist U.S. businesses, institutions of higher education and other organizations to support, promote and accelerate innovation through high-risk, high-reward research in areas of critical national need. Because the TIP Advisory Board is comprised of thought leaders from industry and other organizations, such as institutions of higher education, the Board offers a unique perspective on TIP programs, plans and policies.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The TIP Advisory Board will advise TIP and NIST on its programs, plans and policies. As such, the Board is briefed at its meetings on budget and budget planning, and this may occur before the President's budget is released. Portions of the meetings may therefore be closed for these discussions in accordance with Section

552(b)(9)(B) of Title 5, United States Code, on the basis that they are likely to divulge matters that may significantly frustrate implementation of proposed actions.
