20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 175 and § 10301, the Reserve Forces Policy Board shall serve as an independent adviser to the Secretary of Defense to provide advice and recommendations to the Secretary on strategies, policies, and practices designed to improve and enhance the capabilities, efficiency, and effectiveness of the reserve components. In addition, the Reserve Forces Policy Board may act on those matters referred to it by the Chair and on any matter raised by a member of the Reserve Forces Policy Board or the Secretary of Defense.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Reserve Forces Policy Board's membership is directed by 10 U.S.C. § 10301(c). The membership is balanced across the spectrum between Uniformed Military Members from among

the Seven Reserve Components and ten Special Government Employees from throughout the civilian community that have knowledge and skills to assist in crafting relevant recommendations to the Secretary of Defense in accordance with the governing statute and charter.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The estimated number of meetings per year, for the full organization, is four (4).

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Reserve Forces Policy Board is governed by the following statute: 10 U.S.C. § 175 and § 10301.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the DoD determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions as codified in 5 U.S.C. § 552b(c). Pursuant to DoD policy, DODI 5105.04, 6 Aug 2007, closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor (Honorable Ashish Vazirani Acting Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness for the Reserve Forces Policy Board), and only after consultation with the Office of General Counsel for the DoD.

21. Remarks

On January 30, 2021, Secretary of Defense Austin directed a zero-based review of all DoD advisory committees, to include any advisory committee not subject to the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) (5 U.S.C., Appendix). The Reserve Forces Policy Board was subsequently approved to

June 9, 2022, the Secretary of Defense approved the Reserve Forces Policy Board's Board Membership composition. The Reserve Forces Policy Board's Sponsor, Office of the Undersecretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, approved an initial schedule of quarterly board meetings to be held on July 20, 2022, September 28, 2022, December 7, 2022 (closed), February 15, 2023, and May 9, 2023. The RFPB scheduled and conducted an additional (open) Board Meeting on September 13, 2023. The 2017 NDAA terminated the requirement for the Secretary to submit an annual report per 10 USC 113(c)(2), from the Reserve Forces Policy Board on the reserve programs of the Department of Defense and on any other matters that the Reserve Forces Policy Board considers appropriate to include in the report.

The Board made one (1) recommendation in FY 2023. The Board recommended the SecDef issue a contemporary and comprehensive Department of Defense (DoD) Total Force Policy for uniformed personnel of the Active, National Guard, and Reserve components.

The Secretary of Defense directed a zero-based review of all DoD advisory committees on January 30, 2021. The RFPB was approved to commenced operations on November 29, 2021 with Board Membership approved by SecDef on June 09, 2022. This allowed for the Board to have its first meeting on July 20, 2022. The Board reviewed the status of the pending report recommendations and are strongly supporting them to be implemented. All the recommendations are being staffed within DoD and are currently being reviewed and analyzed by the DoD personnel and budget staffs. Congressional legislative proposals are awaiting Congressional action. The RFPB submitted a recommendations to SecDef for the Department to continue to fully support the ongoing Duty Status Reform efforts led by the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness to actively engage OMB to coordinate proposed duty status' with the required benefits. Support Duty Status Reform as a top tier NDAA 2024 legislative proposal. The RFPB also submitted a recommendation to SecDef for the Department to fully support the Joint Staff Legislative Proposal to reinstate the exemptions for 18 Chairman's Reserve Positions that were eliminated as part of the 2017 NDAA, Section 526, Title 10, U.S.C.
