**20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?**

Federal law and regulation provide the opportunity for continued subsistence uses, including hunting, within the Wrangell-St. Elias National Park. The Subsistence Resource Commission for Wrangell-St. Elias National Park is a forum that promotes effective communication and mutual understanding of subsistence uses and related cultural resources. The Commission consults with every appropriate local advisory committee and regional council for comment and input on draft hunting plan recommendations. In addition to the advisory committee and regional council consultation process directed by P.L. 96-487 (the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act), the Commission is required to hold public meetings in all areas affected by the subsistence hunting program.

**20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?**

Membership, as prescribed by the Commission's enabling legislation, consists of nine members as follows: (a) three members appointed by the Secretary of the Interior; (b) three members appointed by the Governor of Alaska; and (c) three members appointed by the regional council, as established by the Secretary or the Governor pursuant to section 805 of P.L. 96-487. The members include a range of individuals having personal knowledge of the region's subsistence conditions, and having an interest in Federal subsistence management.

**20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?**

Meetings are generally held twice a year, or as often as circumstances require. Commission recommendations are vitally important on matters relating to the taking of wildlife within the park, and are the foundation for the development and review of the subsistence hunting program.

**20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?**

The Commission's recommendations help the NPS to ensure the continuation of the opportunity for local rural residents to engage in the subsistence use of resources in Wrangell-St. Elias National Park and Preserve. The NPS has adopted the following mission statement to guide its activities. Subsistence will be managed as a legislated use consistent with the provisions of ANILCA, the Organic Act of 1916, and park's enabling legislation to:

- protect the opportunity for qualified local rural residents to continue traditional subsistence activities;
- recognize that subsistence ways of life differ from region

to region and are continuing to evolve, and where appropriate, park management practices may reflect regional diversity and evolution; • promote local involvement and participation in processes associated with subsistence management; • ensure that management practices involving the utilization of public lands adequately consider the potential for restriction of subsistence uses and impacts upon subsistence resources; • ensure that management of park resources is consistent with the conservation of unimpaired ecosystems and natural and healthy populations of fish and wildlife, incorporating scientific data and principles with traditional knowledge and cultural values; and • promote effective communication and mutual understanding of subsistence uses and related cultural and social values, and park purposes and protection, between the NPS, subsistence users, the State of Alaska and the public.

#### **20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?**

All meetings are open.

#### **21. Remarks**

The Wrangell St. Elias National Park Subsistence Resource Commission met once in FY2019. The Commission met in Copper Center, AK on October 25-26, 2018.

Recommendations were offered on several Federal fisheries regulatory proposals and the commission adopted the following positions: support for FP19-15, FP19-16, and FP19-17; Support as modified by the Office of Subsistence Management for FP19-13 and FP19-14.

A motion was also approved to write a letter to the NPS Alaska Regional Director supporting proposed changes to regulations regarding hunting and trapping in Alaska National Preserves. The commission also heard topical updates from park staff about trail maintenance, the Superintendent's Compendium, 13,440 subsistence eligibility permits, and recent discussions about caribou herds in the park, as well as general updates from the Divisions of Resource Management, Resource Protection, and Interpretation and Education. Karen Linnell from the Ahtna Intertribal Resource Commission (AITRC) provided a report on AITRC's activities. Frank Robbins from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game provided an update regarding the Nelchina caribou herd, and Jesse Hankins from the Bureau of Land Management reported on federal subsistence harvest opportunities for moose and caribou in Unit 13. A member of the public commented on the lack of opportunities to harvest caribou in Unit 11. (1) EXPECTED CHARTER RENEWAL DATE -- The FACA section 14(b) biennial rechartering requirement has been waived for this committee by P.L. 102-525, October 26, 1992. (2) EXPECTED COMMITTEE TERMINATION DATE/TERMINATION AUTHORITY -- The Commission's enabling legislation, P.L. 96-487, provides for continuation of the Commission into the foreseeable future, without termination. (3) MEMBERSHIP -- In accordance with the Commission Charter and with P.L. 102-525, members may continue to serve after the expiration of

their terms until successors are appointed.

**Number of Recommendations Comments**

The Commission did not submit any new formal recommendations to the Secretary of Interior in FY 2019. The Commission met in Copper Center, AK on October 25-26, 2018. Recommendations were offered on several Federal fisheries regulatory proposals and the commission adopted the following positions: support for FP19-15, FP19-16, and FP19-17; Support as modified by the Office of Subsistence Management for FP19-13 and FP19-14. A motion was also approved to write a letter to the NPS Alaska Regional Director supporting proposed changes to regulations regarding hunting and trapping in Alaska National Preserves. At the March 2018 meeting, the Commission approved a motion to write a letter to the Secretary of the Interior expressing concern for the process to reconsider the NPS Alaska’s 2015 wildlife regulations. The Commission made the following recommendations on Federal Subsistence Management regulatory proposals:- Support with modification Wildlife Special Action Request 17-05 to increase the harvest limit in Unit 12 Remainder to up to 2 caribou and delegate authority to set the harvest limit for the 2017/18 winter season. The recommended modification is to include consultation with affected tribes and the Ahtna Intertribal Resource Commission in the process of exercising the delegation of authority. - Support WP18-10, which would change moose hunting areas and seasons in Unit 5A. - Support WP18-13, which would remove trap marking requirement under federal regulations in Units 1 through 5.
