This Advisory Panel was intended to provide expert advice to the Secretary of the Navy pertaining to his/her oversight of the Department of the Navy...an organization of over 700,000 personnel and a budget exceeding \$170B per year performing continuous worldwide operations. Recommendations have typically pertained to shifts in policy, organization, resources, or capabilities. Intent is to remain ahead of forecast issues, challenges, threats, and risks. Results of recommendations have more directly resulted in affecting measures of relevance than capturing measurable cost savings.
