20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. § 426-2, the BCER shall provide the Secretary of Defense or the Deputy Secretary of Defense ("the DoD Appointing Authority"), through the Secretary of the Army and the Commanding General, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("the Chief of Engineers") with independent advice and recommendations on the work of the Coastal and Hydraulics Laboratory, which includes the Coastal Engineering Research Center, on coastal engineering research priorities and additional functions as assigned by the Chief of Engineers.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. § 426-2, the Board shall be composed of seven members. The DoD, pursuant to the authorizing legislation, shall appoint four officers of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to the Board as ex-officio regular government employee (RGE) members, with one position being occupied by the Deputy Commanding General for Civil and Emergency Operations, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers ("the Deputy Commanding General") for no fixed term of service. The Chief of Engineers, in consultation with the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works), shall determine which three of the eight coastal division commanders shall be nominated to serve as the other ex-officio RGE members of the Board. The Chief of Engineers, in determining which of the coastal division commanders shall serve on the Board, shall consider the individual's tenure as a division commander and his or her expertise in the matters before the Board. The remaining three Board members shall be civilian coastal experts recommended by the Chief of Engineers for their expertise in the fields of beach erosion, shore protection, and coastal processes and infrastructure. The Deputy Commanding General shall serve as the Chair of the Board.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Board meets at the call of the Board's DFO, in consultation with the Board's Chair. The estimated number of Board meetings is two per year. The Board makeup provides effective liaison among Corps District and Division offices, Corps Laboratories involved in coastal engineering research, the academic community, and the private sector.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Federal statute (33 U.S.C. 462-2 P.L. 88-172) requires the Secretary of Defense to establish the committee.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the DoD determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions of 5 U.S.C. § 552b(c). Pursuant to DoD policy closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor, the Secretary of the Army, and only after consultation with the Office of General Counsel for the Department of the Army.

21. Remarks

The Proceedings and minutes are one in the same. The committee does not publish separate reports; the recommendations to the decision maker are contained in the meeting minutes. Brigadier General Daniel Hibner, U.S. Army, Coastal Division Commander, South Atlantic Division, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers appointment term start date is August 23, 2022, but he was erroneously omitted from the FY22 ACR. Brigadier General Jason E. Kelly, U.S. Army, Coastal Division Commander, South Atlantic Division, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers change of Command was August 22, 2022, but this was not reflected in the FY22 ACR.

The Board on Coastal Engineering Research functions as an advisory board to the Chief of Engineers and was established by Public Law in 1963. It was originally the Beach Erosion Board established in 1930. The Board provides broad policy guidance and review of plans and fund requirements for the conduct of research and development of research projects in consonance with the needs of the coastal engineering field and the objectives of the Chief of Engineers. The Corps created the modern discipline of coastal engineering and remains the primary user in the United States to accomplish its mission. Research is essential for the Corps to accomplish its mission in an economically sound,

environmentally correct and safe manner. The Corps conducts, or sponsors, most major coastal engineering research in the United States, and the BCER ensures both short- and long-term needs are met.
