20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Department of Defense (DoD), through Defense Threat Reduction Agency USSTRATCOM Center for Combating WMD (DTRA-SCC-WMD) as the Executive Agent, provided radiation dose estimates for veterans who participated in the 1945-1946 occupation of Hiroshima or Nagasaki or were POWs at Hiroshima or Nagasaki, Japan, and in U.S. sponsored atmospheric nuclear testing between 1945 and 1962. These dose reconstructions were used by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to evaluate and decide veterans' claims filed under the provisions of

Public Law (PL) 98-542 and implementing regulations in Title 38 of the Code of Federal Regulations, part 3.311. Congress directed the Secretaries of DoD and VA under Section 601 of Public Law (PL) 108-183 to appoint an advisory board to provide ongoing independent review and oversight of the Dose Reconstruction Program. The Advisory Board on Veterans' Dose Reconstruction advised DoD and VA, as directed under Section 601 of PL 108-183, as follows: (a) conduct periodic, random audits of dose reconstructions and decisions on claims for radiogenic diseases; (b) assist the VA and DTRA-SCC-WMD in communicating to veterans information on the mission, procedures, and evidentiary requirements of dose reconstruction; (c) carry out other activities with regard to review and oversight of the Dose Reconstruction Program as specified jointly by the Secretaries; and (d) make recommendations on modifications to the mission and procedures of the Dose Reconstruction Program as the Advisory Board considers appropriate as a result of the audits. VA concurs with terminating this committee as it has met its statutory purpose and is no longer necessary.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Board was composed of members as directed by Section 601 of PL 108-183 as follows:- At least one expert in historical dose reconstruction of the type conducted under the Dose Reconstruction Program: (1) At least one expert in radiation health matters; (2) At least one expert in risk communications; (3) A VA representative; (4) A DTRA-SCC-WMD representative; and (5) At least three veterans, including at least one veteran who is a member of an atomic veterans group.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Congress directed the Secretaries of Defense and Veterans Affairs (VA) under Section 601 of Public Law,(PL) 108-183 to appoint an advisory board to provide on-going independent review and oversight of the DoD and VA Veterans' Dose Reconstruction Program. This Advisory Board maintained independent oversight of the procedures used by DTRA-SCC-WMD and the VA in responding to claims filed by veterans. The advisory board provided an avenue for improving communication with veterans and for resolving complex issues related to radiation dose reconstruction and claims adjudication. Both Secretariats believe that the VBDR has met its mandate and the two Secretaries can maintain an effective program.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Number of Recommendations Comments

On the basis of its audits and assessments of Nuclear Test Personnel Review (NTPR) Program radiation dose assessments (RDAs), Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) claim procedures, and other meetings and interactions with both DTRA and VA, the Veterans' Advisory Board on Dose Reconstruction (VBDR) offered one reccomendation to DoD and three recommendations to the VA, and three Joint rommendations at the July 23, 2014 meeting held in Arlington, Virginia. The Board believes that these recommendations, if put into action, would improve the VA compensation program for Atomic Veterans. For the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA): The VBDR recommends that NTPR maintain existing QA programsimplemented under the VBDR including the double blind analyses; continues to conduct periodic independent audits of a sampling of RDAs, the QA programs, and double blinds analyses; and obtain independent peer-reviews of technical documents and revisions or updates in SOPs. For the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA):Recommendation 1: We recommend that by September 13, 2013 the VA correct the problem which causes the delay in transferring veterans' claims from the Office of Original Jurisdiction(OOJ) to Jackson VARO. Recommendation 2: We recommend that by September 15, 2013, the VHA (Office of Public Health) complete production and distribute the briefing package material to the "Big 6" Veterans organizations to inform Veterans about the atomic Veterans claim process. Recommendation 3: We recommend the VA conduct a focused System Technical Accuracy Review (STAR) of the radiation claims every three years. Joint DoD and VA Recomendations: Recommendation 1: We recommend that by September 15, 2013 the VA and NTPR provide the board with a formal plan (to include staffing and other needed resources, ie. VPN) to remove thebacklog.Recommendation 2: We recommend semi-annual meetings of NTPR, VA and the Department of Justice (DOJ) include detailed reports demonstrating case accuracy and timely performance, including current performance, performance trends, corrective action, and related improvements. Recommendation 3: We recommend the semi-annual NTPR, VA and the DOJ meetings include an agenda item to coordinate DTRA and VA Public Affairs outreach efforts, and a report describing the effort is written and reported on the public websites of DTRA and VA.
