20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Federal statute directs the committee to submit of each year, to the Secretary of Defense recommendations on military family readiness. Recommendations, at a minimum, includes the following:1. An assessment of the adequacy and effectiveness of the military family readiness programs and activities of the Department of Defense during the preceding fiscal year in meeting the needs and requirements of military families.2. Recommendations on actions to be taken to improve the capability of the military family readiness programs and activities of the

Department of Defense to meet the needs and requirements of military families, including actions relating to the allocation of funding and other resources to and among such programs and activities.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Council, pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 1781a, shall be comprised of no more than 21 members appointed as follows: (a) In General.-There is in the Department of Defense the Department of Defense Military Family Readiness Council (in this section referred to as the "Council"). (b)

Members.-(1) The Council shall consist of the following members: (A) The Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, who shall serve as chair of the Council and who may designate a representative to chair the council in the Under Secretary's absence. (B) The following persons, who shall be appointed or designated by the Secretary of Defense: (i) One representative of each of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Space Force, each of whom shall be a member or civilian employee of the armed force to be represented. (ii) One representative, who shall be a member or civilian employee of the National Guard Bureau, to represent both the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard. (iii) One spouse or parent of a member of each of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Space Force, two of whom shall be the spouse or parent of an active component member and two of whom shall be the spouse or parent of a reserve component member. (C) Three individuals appointed by the Secretary of Defense from among representatives of military family organizations, including military family organizations of families of members of the

regular components and of families of members of the reserve components. (D) The senior enlisted advisor from each of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Space Force, except that two of these members may instead be selected from among the spouses of the senior enlisted advisors. (E) The Director of the Office of Military Family Readiness Policy.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Council is required to meet at least twice per fiscal year.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Federal statute (10 U.S.C. § 1781a) requires the Secretary of Defense to establish this committee.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the Department of Defense determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions of 5 U.S.C. § 552b(c). Pursuant to DoD policy closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor (i.e., the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness), and only after consultation with the Office of the Department of Defense General Counsel.

21. Remarks

The Military Family Readiness Council is composed of a diverse mix of uniformed and civilian DoD regular government employees, some of whom are ex-officio and some who are chosen individually by the agency head, as well as several special government employees chosen for their unique perspectives as military family members or

members of military family organizations.
