The Commission usually hosts an open forum meeting to the public twice a year.

The Commission is well balanced to perform their function of coordinating the management of the park and the historic district with local jurisdictions. The five municipalities surrounding

the park are represented as are the county and the State Historic Preservation Office. These members are able to represent points of view of their constituencies and conversely to interpret the park's action to them.

The Commission is administratively inactive. The meetings of the Commission are relevant to advise the community of updates on the park happenings and coordinating activities within the Gettysburg National Military Park, Eisenhower National Historic Site and Gettysburg Battlefield Historic District with local governments and the community.

Their individual expertise, varied backgrounds, gathering of information from park managers, local governments, and interested members of the public, the Commission offers a unique perspective, and advice in the management of Gettysburg National Military Park.
