The membership is made up of federal, state and District of Columbia representatives, as well as members from private organizations who have a recognized interest in the trail.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Council is administratively inactive and did not meet in FY 2021. The Council's last meeting was held in FY 2017. The Council worked to continue Trail development and increased community engagement. Council members from Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia, representing community groups, tourism agencies, local and state governments, and non-profit cultural organizations, worked closely as partners during the Trail's initial development and on the commemoration of the Bicentennial of the War of 1812. During this period there was great investment of time and funds by the NPS and these partners. As the Trail entered its current period of transition and second phase of development, the Advisory Council provided advice on strategic planning goals related to recreation, interpretation and education, tourism, and conservation.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

To provide advice and consultation to the Secretary of the Interior and the National Park Service on matters relating to the Star-Spangled Banner National Historic Trail.

The Council did not meet in FY 2021. • January 23, 2017 Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine (Baltimore, MD) Consensus and agreement among group that the future Trail priorities for the next few years would be educational initiatives, special events/interpretation, and promotion through social media and websites. • July 1, 2015 Bladensburg Waterfront Park (Bladensburg, MD) No motions noted; the meeting served as an introductory/ re-gathering of the Council since this was the first time the group met after the Trail administration transitioned from the NPS Chesapeake Bay Office to Fort McHenry NM&HS. • November 4, 2014 Accokeek Foundation (Accokeek, MD) Joint meeting with the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National Historic Trail Advisory Council Meeting Meeting rescheduled • September 30, 2014 NPS Chesapeake Bay Offices (Annapolis, MD) No motions noted; this was a sub-committee of the STSP Advisory Council; the group discussed future Trail goals, activities, and metrics now that the bicentennial commemoration was over. development of the Trails. • October 17, 2012 Kings Landing Park (Huntingtown, MD) No motion noted; trail and bicentennial updates presented; two-year action plan and the creation of a "friends" trail partner were discussed • June 28, 2011 Fort McHenry national Monument and Historic Shrine (Baltimore, MD) Trail plan introduced; alternative management concepts, public scoping workshops, signage project; interpretive planning, bicentennial efforts, and funding opportunities were discussed; no motions noted
