The FRRCC provides independent advice to the EPA Administrator on a range of environmental issues and policies that are of importance to agriculture and rural communities. The Charter for the Farm, Ranch, and Rural Communities Federal Advisory Committee (FRRCC) was filed as renewed in February 2018, but the Committee has since been inactive following the departure of the Senior Advisor to the Administrator for Agriculture Policy from the Agency in March 2018.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The FRRCC membership represents the viewpoints of various groups, including: academia; agriculture and associated industries; non-governmental organizations; and state, local, and tribal governments. Nominations for membership on the FRRCC are solicited through the Federal Register and other sources, including advertisement through listservs, websites, press releases, and consultation with representatives from the EPA regions and program offices.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Meetings occur approximately twice a year at 6 month intervals. The Charter for the Farm, Ranch, and Rural Communities Federal Advisory Committee (FRRCC) was filed as renewed in February 2018, but the Committee has since been inactive following the departure of the Senior Advisor to the Administrator for Agriculture Policy from the Agency in March 2018.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The FRRCC provides a forum for discussion and an opportunity to provide policy advice to the EPA Administrator on a range of environmental issues and policies that are of importance to agriculture and rural communities. The FRRCC also plays a critical role in the Agency's efforts to expand cooperative working relationships with the agricultural community and others who are interested in agricultural issues to achieve greater progress in environmental protection.

This process often is incremental and takes place over a long time frame, thus making it very difficult to decisively determine that any of the recommendations of the FRRCC have been fully implemented at a given point in time.

In January 2017, former Administrator McCarthy responded to the FRRCC soil health report outlining the progress the agency has made in developing collaborations and partnerships with agricultural stakeholders to advance soil health. The FRRCC submitted several recommendations in its report dated December 2011. EPA responded in March 2012 that it would review the issues raised by the committee and consider how EPA might make use of them. In the past, the FRRCC's January 2009 advice letter was submitted to former Administrator Johnson, and Administrator Jackson responded to the FRRCC's advice letter with a formal response letter indicating that significant portions of the FRRCC's recommendations had been implemented. In addition, Administrator Jackson indicated in her response to the FRRCC's assorted advice letters submitted in September 2009 that the Agency had already begun to implement some of the Committee's advice and recommendations, and that the others would be referred to the appropriate Agency staff for consideration and implementation.
