20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Maritime Advisory Committee for Occupational Safety and Health (MACOSH) provides advice in formulating maritime industry standards and regarding matters pertaining to the administration of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (OSH Act) related to the maritime industry. Additionally, MACOSH provides feedback to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) on the development of guidance and outreach materials tailored to individual sectors of the maritime industry, as well as other activities to help focus actions in the

industry and reduce work-related deaths, injuries, and illnesses.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

MACOSH comprises 15 representatives appointed by the Secretary. At present, the committee consists of four management representatives, four labor representatives, three representatives of occupational safety and health professions, and four government representatives, one of whom is from a state safety and health agency, and another designated by the Secretary of Health and Human Services. In addition, the head of the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP) is assigned to the committee as a non-voting, Special Agency Liaison (SAL) member. The SAL is assigned because of OWCP's work in administering the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Act, which protects most waterfront workers. Members are selected from a cross-section of parties directly affected, interested, and qualified as appropriate to the character and functions of MACOSH. To the extent permitted by law, membership is also consistent with achieving the greatest impact, scope, and credibility among diverse stakeholders.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The charter provides for two meetings per year. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2022, two meetings were held virtually on February 15 and June 9, 2022. The Shipyard Workgroup met nine times and the Longshoring Workgroup eight times through teleconference meetings. MACOSH is expected to meet twice in FY23. To date the committee has provided 194 recommendations. Between 2019 and 2022, collaboration of industry experts has

resulted in the development of twenty three guidance products, targeting high-hazard occupations in the maritime industry, that were recommended to OSHA for publication. MACOSH meeting and workgroup materials can be found at www.regulations.gov under docket OSHA-2020-0010.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

MACOSH provides a collective expertise, not otherwise available, to the Secretary to assist in addressing the unique hazards found in shipyards, marine cargo handling, and commercial fishing activities. The maritime industry is highly specialized, with activities ranging from manufacturing work in some shipyards, to transportation work in longshoring operations. In an effort to help reduce the high number of fatalities, injuries, and illnesses experienced in this industry, the agency seeks advice from MACOSH to provide insight on the aforementioned issues, as well as assist in the development of guidance and outreach materials, updating of regulatory requirements, and other efforts to help focus industry actions.

Between 2019 and 2022, MACOSH recommended the publication of twenty three guidance products. The agency has published nine of those

recommendations and is considering the others. Industry feedback reports that OSHA's publication of MACOSH-recommended products greatly assists employers and workers in reducing and preventing injuries, illnesses, and fatalities in the maritime industry. In addition, MACOSH continues to provide valuable input with regards to rulemaking, such as the revision or update of 29 CFR Part 1915, Subpart E.
