20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Committee will act solely as an advisory body to the Secretary on matters relating to the study, development, and implementation of intelligent transportation systems (ITS). The Committee will provide input into the development of the ITS strategic plan and review ITS research proposals which are under funding consideration by the Department.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The ITSPAC shall comprise not more than 25 individuals appointed by the Secretary of Transportation upon recommendation by the Assistant Secretary for Research and Technology or designee. The ITSPAC membership shall comprise members from among the following categories and be balanced between metropolitan and rural interests: (a) a representative from a State highway department; (b) a representative from a local highway department who is not from a metropolitan planning organization; (c)a representative from a State, local, or regional transit agency; (d) a representative from a State, local, or regional wildlife, land use, or resource management agency; (e) a representative from a metropolitan planning organization; (f) a representative of a national transit association; (g) a representative of a national, State, or local transportation agency or association; (h) a private sector user of intelligent transportation system technologies; (i) a private sector developer of intelligent transportation system technologies, which may include emerging vehicle technologies; (j) an academic researcher with expertise in computer science or another information science field related to intelligent transportation systems, and who is not an expert on transportation issues; (k) an academic researcher who is a civil engineer; (I) an academic researcher who is a social scientist with expertise in transportation issues; (m) an academic researcher who is a biological or ecological scientist with expertise in transportation issues; (n) a representative from a nonprofit group representing the intelligent transportation system industry; (o) a representative from a public interest group concerned with safety; (p) a representative of a labor organization; (q) a representative of a mobility-providing entity; (r) an expert in traffic

management; (s) a representative from a public interest group concerned with the impact of the transportation system on land use and residential patterns; (t) a representative from a public interest group concerned with the impact of the transportation system on terrestrial and aquatic species and the habitat of those species; and (u) members with expertise in planning, safety, telecommunications, and operations; (v) an expert in cybersecurity; and (w) an automobile manufacturer.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Estimated Number of Meetings per Year – 2 to 3. The committee chair coordinates with the DFO and ITS Joint Program Office management to schedule meetings and develop meeting agendas relevant to the committee's purpose and duties."

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Committee is necessary to provide a forum for national discussion and recommendations on ITS activities, system architecture, standards, human factors, deployment strategies, international liaison, eductation/outreach, and program activities. Establishment of the committee is mandated by Public Law 109-59; Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU); August 10, 2005; Section 5305 (h).
