**20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?**

Consistent with Congress' expressed desire that federal agencies work together to coordinate their juvenile justice and delinquency prevention efforts, the Coordinating Council on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (Council), established by Section 206 of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974, as amended, promotes and encourages federal interagency

cooperation on issues pertaining to juvenile justice, delinquency prevention and control, and missing and exploited children. Please visit the Coordinating Council website at:

**20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?**

As set out in the statute establishing the Coordinating Council (34 U.S.C. § 11116), its membership is “composed of the Attorney General, the Secretary of Health and Human Services, the Assistant Secretary for Mental Health and Substance Use, the Secretary of the Interior, the Secretary of Labor, the Secretary of Education, the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, the Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, the Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy, the Chief Executive Officer of AmeriCorps, the Assistant Secretary for Immigration and Customs Enforcement, such other officers of Federal agencies who hold significant decision making authority as the President may designate, and individuals appointed [as practitioners].” Practitioner members represent a broad cross-section of professionals directly involved with juveniles and the juvenile justice system. Appointments included three Presidential selections, three by the Speaker of the House, three by the Majority leader of the Senate. A 10th practitioner member position is appointed by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs. Appointed members hold terms for one, two or three years and each appointing authority may fill vacancies arising during terms.

**20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?**

The full Council typically meets quarterly. Meetings address the coordination of federal programs related to delinquency, unaccompanied juveniles, and missing and exploited children.

**20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?**

The Council provides a critical forum for Executive Branch agency leadership to jointly review matters of policy, practice and program that directly impact the viability of juvenile justice and prevention of delinquency and to determine how best to coordinate and leverage federal resources directed at prevention and crime control. Practitioner members help to ensure that deliberations of the Council reflect and meet the needs and concerns of state and local jurisdictions.
