20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Council is composed of both scientific and public members who provide the second level of peer review, advise on policy development, program implementation and evaluation, and

research needs and opportunities of the Institute. The Council reviewed 984 applications requesting \$1,915,869,632 that were reviewed by initial review groups and special emphasis panels for NIAAA.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The National Advisory Council on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism is composed of not more than 18 appointed members with research interests and responsibilities paralleling those of the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism. Two-thirds of the members are leading representatives of the health and scientific disciplines (including public health and the behavioral or social sciences). One-third of the members are representatives of the general public, including leaders in the fields of public policy, law, health policy, economics, and management. The Council will also consist of at least five nonvoting ex officio members which will include the Secretary; the Director, NIH; the Director, NIAAA; the Under Secretary for Health of the Department of Veterans Affairs; the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs (or their designees); and any additional officers or employees of the United States as the Secretary determines necessary for the Council to effectively carry out its functions.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Meetings are held not less than three times each fiscal year. The National Advisory Council on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NCAA) met on December 14, 2022, February 9, 2023, May 10-11, 2023, and September 7, 2023. The NCAA met together with the Advisory Councils of NIDA

and NCI on May 10, 2023. The NCAA provides advice on a continuing basis on the type of scientific research programs that should be supported and on how to carry out the designated mission and responsibilities of the Institute. It also provides ongoing review of the relevance and effectiveness of the existing programs.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The National Advisory Council on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism is composed of both scientific and public members who provide the second level of review for research grant applications; advise on policy development, program implementation and evaluation; and research needs and opportunities of the Institute. The quality, scope, and balance of advice from this Council cannot be obtained from NIH staff or from other established sources because the membership of the Council is constituted to meet the specific requirements of the mandated mission of the Council and of the Institute.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the National Advisory Council on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism were either closed or partially closed to the public for the review of grant applications. Sections 552b(c)(4) and 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permit the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal confidential trade secrets or commercial property such as patentable material and personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

21. Remarks

Committee Function: Other - National Scientific and Advisory. Reports: This Committee did not produce any public reports. Max Number of Members Total: The Charter allows the Committee to have 23 number of authorized members included but not limited to 18 SGEs and 5 Ex-Officio Members. There is currently no Ex Officio Member from the Department of Veterans Affairs, as such there are only four Ex-Officio Members (Xavier Becerra, George Koob, Charles Milliken, and Lawrence Tabak) which is a total of 22 members, one less than than Max number of members. Members Rotating Off/On-Boarding: Three members rotated-off (Drs. Jill Becker, Constance Horgan, and Scott Russo) and three were on-boarded (Drs. Nancy Gonzales, David Kareken, and Michael Lewis). This is why the Charter states 23 potential members, but this ACR lists 22. Ex Officio Chair: Dr. George Koob was reappointed. As such, his term of service end date is different than what was reported on the FY22 ACR. Members: The terms for Drs. Jill Becker, Constance Horgan, and Scott Russo were administratively extended. As such, their term of service end dates are different than what was reported on the FY22 ACR. Designated Federal Officer (DFO): The DFO for the NCAA changed in FY23 and has been reflected in the ACR. The DFO and Committee Decision Maker positions are held by the same individual because of the assignment of responsibilities within the Institute.

Research grant applications submitted to NIH must go through a two-step review process that includes the initial peer review for scientific and technical merit and a second step of review and approval by a National Advisory Council that includes program relevance. In addition, prior to an award or funding being made, NIH staff must conduct an administrative review for a number of other considerations. These include alignment with NIH's funding principles, review of the project budget, assessment of the applicant's management systems, determination of applicant eligibility, and compliance with public policy requirements. After all these steps have been completed, NIH officials make funding decisions on individual grant applications.
