## 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Council provides advice and conveys specific policy recommendations, usually in the form of an official report or letter, to the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions of the Senate, and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives. The Council provides the only public forum for presenting and discussing information on the supply and distribution of physician, including specialists, international medical graduate issues, the financing of medical education, and changes in medical education programs. The Council assesses physician workforce trends, medical training issues, and financing policies, and recommends appropriate federal and private sector efforts on these topics. COGME advises and makes recommendations to the Secretary of HHS and Congress.

## 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Council consists of 18 members: The Assistant Secretary for Health (or designee); the Administrator of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (or designee); the Chief Medical Director of the Department of Veterans Affairs (or designee); the Administrator of the Health Resources and Services Administration (or designee); and 14 members appointed by the Secretary of HHS to include representatives of practicing primary care physicians, national and specialty physician organizations, international medical graduates, medical student and house staff associations, representatives of schools of medicine and osteopathy, public and private teaching hospitals, and representatives of health insurers, business, and labor.

## 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

COGME shall meet at least twice per year to discuss topics relevant to graduate medical education workforce and training.

## 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

There is no other Council or Committee in HRSA,

or HHS, that has the same charge as the Council on Graduate Medical Education. No other public advisory body offers recommendations on the issues of physician workforce and medical education from the combined perspective of primary care and specialty medicine representing allopathic and osteopathic medical schools, practicing physicians, medical students and house staff, physician professional associations, hospital representatives, business, labor, and health insurers.

## 20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

N/A, all meetings held by this Council are open to the public.

#### 21. Remarks

Since 1988, the Council has produced 502 recommendations through 24 reports, 21 resource papers, and 17 letters to the Secretary of HHS and Congress. Term End Dates for non-federal members Peter Hollman, Surendra Varma, and Warren Jones changed from 11/22/2024 to 02/25/2025 due to an extension. Joan Weiss replaced Paul Jung as HRSA's ex-officio member effective 8/28/2024; Paul Jung's term end date changed to 7/01/2024 as a result.
