# 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Board of Scientific Counselors provides advice and makes recommendations regarding feasible goals for the prevention and control of injuries. The Board also carries out secondary peer review of extramural research grant and cooperative agreement applications submitted for consideration by the primary scientific peer review panel, and makes funding recommendations for approval by the Director of the National Center for

### 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Members possess a wide range of expertise in the following disciplines involved in injury and violence prevention, including, but not limited to, epidemiologists, statisticians, trauma surgeons, rehabilitation medicine specialists, behavioral scientists, health economists, practitioners, program evaluation specialists, and specialists in various aspects of injury management. The Program continues to identify and seek members who are female and from ethnic/racial minority groups, as well as maintain a geographic balance, in order to achieve the broadest possible representation of different points of view. Solicitation for nominations are sought from senior scientists in the Injury Center, as well as, national injury- and violence-related organizations and a review of expertise in the field.

## 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Board met three times during the 2023 fiscal year: May 3, 2023, May 4, 2023, and June 8, 2023. During the May 3, 2023 meeting, the agenda focused on the Secondary Peer Review of extramural research grant applications received in response to two (2) Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs): RFA-CE-23-001 – "Evaluating Practice-based Programs, Policies, and Practices from CDCs Rape Prevention and Education (RPE) Program: Expanding the Evidence to Prevent Sexual Violence (U01)"; RFA-CE-23-008 – "Research Grants to Develop and Validate a Prognostic Tool of Mental Health Sequelae After Traumatic Brain Injury for Adolescent Patients (U01)", The May 4, 2023

meeting included discussions on Improving the Quality and Reach of Extramural Research Notice and Funding Opportunities; Updated and Expanded CDC Guidance for the Identification and Response of Suicide Clusters; Developing Cascade of Care Framework and Surveillance Indicator to Measure Linkage and Retention to care for Substance Use Disorders and Moving Science and Data to Violence Prevention Action. The June 8, 2023 meeting focused on the Secondary Peer Review of extramural research grant applications received in response to five (5) Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs): RFA-CE23-002 Grants to Support New Investigators in Conducting Research Related to Understanding Polydrug Use Risk and Protective Factors; RFA-CE23-003 Grants to Support New Investigators in Conducting Research Related to Preventing Interpersonal Violence Impacting Children and Youth; RFA-CE23-004 Research Grants for Preventing Violence and Violence Related Injury (R01); RFA-CE23-005 Research Grants to Inform Firearm-Related Violence and Injury Prevention Strategies (R01);RFA-CE23-006 Research Grants to Rigorously Evaluate Innovative and Promising Strategies to Prevent Firearm-Related Violence and Injuries (R01).

## 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Board of Scientific Counselors is the primary mechanism for bringing together diverse disciplines in the field of injury and violence prevention and control to interact and focus their collective expertise on establishing, maintaining, and evaluating prevention programs to control morbidity, mortality, and costs attributable to intentional and unintentional injury. This board also provides a forum to promote coordination

among Federal, State, and local health agencies, as well as organizations having an impact at the community level, to promote and control injuries and violence in order to change the public's common conception of inevitability into one of preventability. The Board's advice and recommendations are essential in addressing CDC's current research needs and monitoring progress on current research studies. The Board continues to play a critical role in prioritizing injury and violence problems that should be addressed.

### 20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Some of the meetings that the Board convenes must be closed during the secondary-level peer review of research applications for research grants, cooperative agreements and contracts due to the discussion of sensitive and proprietary scientific information. This practice is in compliance with the Government in the Sunshine Act and with peer review policies and procedures.

The Board recommends areas of research to be supported by grants and cooperative agreements and provides concept review of program proposals and funding opportunity announcements.
