20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The ACOT membership includes individuals knowledgeable in such fields as deceased and living organ donation, health care public policy, transplantation medicine and surgery, critical care medicine and other medical specialties involved in the identification and referral of donors, non-physician transplant professions, nursing, epidemiology, immunology, law and bioethics, behavioral sciences, economics and statistics, as well as representatives of transplant candidates, transplant recipients, living organ donors, and family members of deceased and living organ donors. To the extent practicable, Committee members should represent the minority, gender and geographic diversity of transplant candidates, transplant recipients, organ donors and family members served by the OPTN.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The ACOT meets up to three times a year in full session to advise the Secretary of HHS on matters related to organ transplantation.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The ACOT members represent the various stakeholders that have an interest in solid organ transplantation, Members provide advice and recommendations to the Secretary of HHS based on their transplant-related scientific clinical, operational, and personal experience.
