20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Advisory Committee on Interdisciplinary, Community-Based Linkages (ACICBL) prepares annual reports, as directed in the statute, to be submitted to the Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS); the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate; and to the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives. The ACICBL will also, as needed, produce letters to the Secretary of HHS and to Congress on specific topics of interest that may be of a time sensitive basis and therefore, cannot be included in an actual report.

Committee report submission is based on the calendar year.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The ACICBL is composed of up to 14 individuals who are health professionals from schools of the types described in Public Health Service Act sections 751(b)(l)(A), 753(b), and 755(b). At least 75 percent of the members are health professionals and include a broad geographic representation as well as a balance between urban and rural members and an adequate representation of women and minorities.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The ACICBL meets not less than three times each calendar year, per the Committee's authorizing legislation.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The nexus of the Committee's work is on interdisciplinary, community-based perspectives regarding traditional and non-traditional approaches to preparing a health workforce capable of utilizing the knowledge and competencies of all health professions disciplines to meet local and national health care needs. Collaboration, integrative partnerships, interprofessional service systems, and comprehensive health care that integrates primary care with geriatrics and behavioral/mental health care are the working concepts the Committee members use to analyze existing education and training policies and render both strategic and statutory recommendations and advice to the Secretary of HHS, the Committee on Health,

Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate, and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives. There is no other standing Committee or source that can provide such inputs or perspectives on interdisciplinary health workforce development.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings? N/A. Meetings are open.

21. Remarks

Paul Juarez resigned on June 21, 2023 and therefore, their membership term date was changed from 09/11/2022 - 09/10/2025 to 09/11/2022 - 06/21/2023. Donna Fick resigned on June 21, 2023 and therefore, their membership term date was changed from 08/01/2021 - 08/01/2024 to 08/01/2021 - 06/21/2023. Narrative Description

The ACICBL provides advice and recommendations on a broad range of issues dealing with programs and activities authorized under Title VII, Part D of the PHS Act, as amended by the Affordable Care Act. The ACICBL was created by Congress to provide advice and recommendations to the Secretary and to the Congress specific to HRSA/BHW programs that support interdisciplinary, community-based training to include: Area Health Education Centers, Geriatrics, Allied Health, Chiropractic, Podiatric Medicine, the Quentin N. Burdick Program, Mental and Behavioral Health Education and Training, Graduate Psychology Education, Addiction Medicine Fellowships, and Integrated Substance Use Disorder Training. This past year, two new programs were funded out of Title VII, Part D, and as such, are now under the purview of the ACICBL. Those two programs are the Addicting Medicine Fellowship and the Integrated Substance Use Disorder Training Programs. The Committee is the single entity in existence which performs this function for the Department. The Advisory Committee supports the Agency's mission to provide national leadership, program resources, and services needed to improve access to culturally competent, high quality health care. The Committee addresses Goal 1: Improve Access to Quality Health Care and Services; Goal 2: Strengthen the Health Workforce; and Goal 4: Improve Health Equity.
