20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

GGAC held three face to face meetings during FY 18. A face to face meeting was held in October, April and September. GGAC met with VA leaders and representatives from program offices across VHA. Topics included the Veteran Allocation Resource Model, the Choose Home and VA Whole Health Initiatives, CLC Compare, VHA Workforce Services, and Community Care. Six new recommendations were developed to advise the SECVA on matters related to geriatrics and gerontology. The committee also conducted 4 site visits to Ann Arbor, the Bronx, Palo Alto, and Tennessee to review GRECCs and GEC programs. GGAC's FY 18 committee activity accomplished its purpose in FY 18 as related to VA's Strategic Goals: 1, 2, 3, and 4 (listed below). During discussions on CLC Compare, GGAC formulated a recommendation favoring increased transparency and accountability. Based off of discussions with representatives on the Choose Home and Whole Health Initiatives, and the Office of Community Care, GGAC was supportive and recommended that VHA leadership integrate these principles during their efforts in modernizing and horizontally re-structuring VHA. The Choose Home and Whole Health Initiatives also embody the principles of long term care and they believe these programs support a Veteran's wellbeing and independence throughout life. VA Strategic Goals below: • Goal 1: Veterans choose VA for easy access, greater choices, and clear information to make informed decisions, page 11 • Goal 2: Veterans receive timely and integrated care and support that emphasizes their well-being and independence throughout their life journey, page 15 • Goal 3: Veterans trust VA to be consistently accountable and transparent, page 23 • Goal 4: VA will modernize systems and focus resources more efficiently to be competitive and to provide World Class capabilities to Veterans and its employees, page 27

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Committee is composed of non-federal members represented by leading medical and allied health experts in the fields of geriatric medicine, psychiatry, psychology, dentistry, nursing, social work, pharmacy and education from the non-Federal public and private sectors. Representatives of stakeholder groups (e.g., Veterans services organizations) have membership on the Committee as well. Efforts are made to ensure the membership has suitable diversity through balanced representation by gender, ethnicity, discipline and academic/non-academic status. Occupants of key positions in government agencies that are concerned with aging and health resources serve as ex-officio members.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee meets twice a year and has substantive discussions with VA officials concerning development of VA physician and other health professional geriatric leadership, geriatric/gerontological research and geriatric fellowships; reviews proposed legislation and existing and proposed VA- and non-VA programs impacting VA's geriatric and long term care services; and reviews GRECC performance measures.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Committee represents a unique blend of non-VA academic, clinical, health policy, and research expertise combined with legislatively astute stakeholder/customer perspectives that would not be available through any other means. External review of VA geriatric programs by non-VA experts provides objectivity and broadens VA perspectives.
