20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The purpose of a Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act resource advisory committee is to provide advice and recommendations to the Forest Service consistent with Division C, Title VI of Public Law 110-343. The Act describes the duties of the committees as follows: to review projects proposed by counties and other interested parties; to recommend projects and funding; to provide early and continuous coordination with Forest Service officials; to provide frequent opportunities for citizens, organizations, tribes, land management agencies and other interested parties to participate openly and meaningfully, beginning in the early stages of project development; to monitor projects approved under the Act; to advise the designated federal official on the progress of monitoring; and to make recommendations for any appropriate changes or adjustments to projects being monitored.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The committee is comprised of 15 members, five in each of three categories prescribed in the Act. Within each category, the Act identifies specific interests members are to represent. Committees are formed in geographic areas to ensure each national forest located within a participating county or counties has access to a resource advisory committee. The Act requires members to be residents of the state or states within which the committee has jurisdiction.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The committee generally meets 1-4 times per year as needed to perform its duties.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The RAC is necessary to improve collaborative

relationships among the people that use and care for the National Forests and to provide advice and recommendations to the Forest Service concerning projects and funding consistent with Title II of the Act.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings are open to the public.

Past years: FY2008: 113 recommendations FY2009: 95 recommendations FY2010: 102 recommendations FY2011: 62 recommendations FY2012: 67 recommendations FY2013: 63 recommendations FY2013: 23 recommendations were not funded due to the reduction of funding that resulted from the effects of sequestration. FY2014: all Title II funds were allocated to the previously approved but unfunded recommendations from FY2013. FY2015: 63 recommendations, with 59 fully or partially approved. FY2016: 82 project submissions with 69 fully or partially approved FY2017: No new recommendations due to no RAC activity FY2018: No new recommendations due to lack of quorum. FY2019: RAC made 27 recommendations on recreation fee proposals for the Willamette National Forest and the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area. Additionally, FY17 title II funds were obligated to support projects originally recommended by the RAC in FY15/16. FY2021: 71 recommendations made; all were fully approved.
