Offer recommendations on how to foster an effective ongoing collaborative framework to ensure engagement of federal, state, local and Tribal governments; private organizations and affected interests; the scientific community; and other

stakeholders.• Offer recommendations for integrating the land management planning process with landscape scale restoration activities through implementation of the planning rule.
