20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

A new charter was signed on May 4, 2023 by VA's Secretary (SECVA). The Committee reports to the SECVA through the Executive Director, Caregiver Support Program, Veterans Health Administration. In carrying out its primary responsibility of providing advice to the SECVA, the Committee will provide a report to the SECVA not later than July 1 of each even-numbered year, which includes: (1) an assessment of the needs, supports and services for Veterans' families, caregivers and survivors across all generations and service eras; (2) a review of the programs and activities of the Department designed to meet such needs; (3) find and provide opportunities to further integrate Veterans' families, caregivers, and survivors into

VA's systems of care, including recommendations on how VA can improve and/or expand delivery of Veterans Health Administration (VHA), Veterans Benefits Administration and National Cemetery Administration services and benefits; and (4) such recommendations (including) recommendations for administrative and legislative action) as the Committee considers appropriate.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Committee will be comprised of not more than 20 committee members, who will be appointed by the SECVA. A member's term of service may not exceed 2 years, but the Secretary may reappoint any member for additional terms, if good cause for reappointment exists. Members will be comprised of a cross section of Veterans' Families, Caregivers, Survivors and stakeholders with an interest or expertise in these areas, and other subject matter experts. The Committee membership will be drawn from various sectors and organizations, including but not limited to: caregivers; Veteran-focused organizations; military history and academic communities; Veterans Service Organizations; Military Service Organizations; the National Association of State Directors of Veterans Affairs; non-profit, private and corporate partners; the Federal executive branch; research experts; service providers; Veterans' Families, Caregivers and Survivors; and leaders of key stakeholder associations and organizations. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may appoint a VA Program Office and other VA program officials who provide services to Veterans' Families, Caregivers or Survivors to serve as ex-officio members. Members may be Special Government Employees, Regular Government Employees or representatives from

Veteran-focused organizations who have a variety of backgrounds and knowledge sufficient to provide adequate advice and guidance to the Secretary. The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Committee will be appointed by the Executive Director, Caregiver Support Program, Veterans Health Administration, on behalf of the Secretary, from among the Committee members.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee is expected to meet at least two times annually and may have additional meetings, if necessary. During this reporting period FY 2023, the full Committee met virtually October 28, 2022; subcommittees met December 20, 2022 and reported to the full Committee during their meeting on January 25-26, 2023.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

VA only offers limited programs and services to these populations and does not have a direct line to these populations to better understand their need and concerns.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

During this reporting period, there were no closed or partially closed meetings. The Committee meetings are open to the public except when the Committee is introducing tours of VA facilities or participating in off-site events. When applicable, tours of VA facilities are closed, to protect Veterans' privacy and personal information.
