# 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Council uses formal advisory committee meetings, webinars, web conferences, working groups, and other methods to accomplish its goals, consistent with the requirements of the FACA. The ACDE does not have subcommittees. The ACDE did not meet in FY 2015 as there was not a quorum for members to meet.

#### 20b. How does the Committee balance its

#### membership?

The Council membership is Co-Chaired by the Secretary of Defense or his/her designee; the Secretary of Education or his/her designee. In addition the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Education have one representative that serves on the Council. The DoDEA Director serves as Executive Secretary of the Council. Public Law 112-90 outlines that the members shall include 1) representatives of professional employee organizations;2) school administrators;3) parents of dependents enrolled in the Defense dependents' education system, and;4) one student enrolled in such a systemEvery effort is made to ensure that the membership of DoD federal advisory committees is fairly balanced in terms of points of view represented and the committee's function.

### 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Council is required to meet at least twice annually, it does not specify in the statute that this within the fiscal or calendar year. The ACDE did not meet in FY 2014 as there was not a quorum for members to meet. A membership package was submitted in December 2013 for membership appointments and to date appointments have not been made, and therefore there is not a quorum to convene the council. DoDEA fulfills the originally intended oversight responsibilities of ACDE and has moved beyond it with a formal collaborative relationship with the Department of Education (ED) and the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO). Both ED and CCSSO provide guidance and support on DoDEA's educational programs and oversight responsibilities. There is no valid rationale for why DoDEA should still have a federal advisory committee providing

recommendations on curriculum and other areas, especially when the recommendations are generally complimentary and have not impacted any changes with respect to the operation of these schools. In addition, the costs of operating the ACDE have more than doubled since 1994.

### 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The ACDE, established in 1978 by Public Law 95-561, Education Amendments of 1978, was enacted 30 years ago to ensure DoD effectively operated this overseas school system since DoD was not an educational entity. The defense dependents' education system and the defense domestic elementary and secondary schools (located on installations in the United States) are operated by the Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA). The DoDEA worldwide schools are recognized as some of the best compared to public schools in the United States. DoDEA, as the parent organization for both the DoD K-12 overseas and domestic school systems, performs an oversight function for these systems not present when the ACDE was established. DoDEA fulfills the originally intended oversight responsibilities of ACDE and has moved beyond it with a formal collaborative relationship with the Department of Education (ED) and the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO). Both ED and CCSSO provide guidance and support on DoDEA's educational programs and oversight responsibilities. There is no valid rationale for why DoDEA should still have a federal advisory committee providing recommendations on curriculum and other areas, especially when the recommendations are generally complimentary and have not impacted any changes with respect to the operation of these schools. In addition, the

costs of operating the ACDE have more than doubled since 1994.
