20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The National Institute for Literacy Advisory Board (Board) accomplishes its purpose by providing advice on Institute activities through quarterly in-person meetings, committee meetings, and regular telephone and email contact with the Institute's Director and Interagency Governing Group. The Board stays abreast of Institute activities and broader developments regarding literacy through briefings from the Institute's Director.

20b. How does the Committee balance its

membership?

The 10 Advisory Board members provided a wide variety of perspectives on literacy. The Board includes representatives of the research community, higher education, foundations, early childhood education, and the K-12 system. The diversity of Board members' backgrounds helps ensure that the Institute is fully aware of issues associated with literacy across the lifespan and can benefit from knowledge resident throughout the field of education.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Advisory Board met quarterly.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

While it would be possible to get advice on the Institute's operations from other sources, a standing advisory committee benefits the Institute in a number of ways. First, it provides a dependable source of advice that would be hard to replicate from an ad hoc group of individuals. Many of the Institute's projects are complex, multi-year efforts. Having sustained advice from a knowledgeable group is critical to the success of these projects. The diverse backgrounds of the Institute's Board also ensures that the Institute does not leave out a segment of the literacy community in its plans and strengthens its ties to all groups that can benefit from its work. And lastly, the Institute benefits from having a standing Advisory Board because members are more likely to dedicate their time to Institute matters than individuals without such an affiliation.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act repealed and replaced WIA, including the AEFLA; see P.L. 113-128, section 511(a), July 22, 2014. The new version of the AEFLA does not include NIFL.
