# 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

On May 5, 2010, Secretary Sebelius signed the Charter re-establishing the Advisory Committee on Head Start Research and Evaluation. The charter reiterates the requirements spelled out in the Head Start Act, as amended by the 2007 reauthorization. The Committee is to review and make recommendations on the design of the study or studies that provide a national analysis of the

impact of Head Start programs; and also advise the Secretary regarding the progress of the study and comment, if the Committee desires, on the interim and final reports of the organizations selected to carry out the independent research. The Committee shall maintain and advise the Secretary and the Assistant Secretary for ACF regarding the progress of the research that is providing a national analysis of the impact of Head Start programs.

# 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Committee consists of 19 members. The Assistant Secretary for the Administration for Children and Families serves as the chair of the Committee. The Committee is well represented geographically, ethnically, and by expertise. The membership consists of individuals with expertise in the areas of program evaluation and research, education, child care, education policy and economics.

# 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee may meet up to three times a year.

# 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This Committee is required by Congress. In Section 649(g) of the Head Start Act requires the Secretary to appoint an independent panel of experts to review and make recommendations on the design for a plan for research on the impact of Head Start, to advise the Secretary regarding the progress of the research, and to comment on the interim and final research reports.

The Committee's three broad recommendations are: 1) With school readiness and other key outcomes as beacons, strengthen Head Start as a learning organization that: (1) is characterized by a commitment to using data for continuous improvement to further strengthen outcomes; (2) develops appropriate assessments and helps programs use their results to guide practice; and (3) integrates and aligns all practices, policies, and supports toward achieving these outcomes within local programs, across federal components of the program, and from federal to local levels. 2) Implement the strongest and most current evidence-based practices that either: (1) benefit all children; or (2) are tailored for population subgroups. Continue to develop and test new refinements, particularly for specific subgroups, thereby further building the evidence.3)Further improve continuity and coordination of early childhood services beginning during the prenatal period and continuing to age 8.
