20a. How does the Committee accomplish itspurpose?Executive Order 13270 states "it is the policy ofthe Federal Government that this Nation'scommitment to educational excellence andopportunity must extend as well to the tribalcolleges and universities (tribal colleges) thatserve Indian tribes and Alaska Native entities. ThePresident's Board of Advisors on Tribal Collegesand Universities (the "Board") and the WhiteHouse Initiative on Tribal Colleges andUniversities (WHITCU) established by this ordershall ensure that this national policy regardingtribal colleges is carried out with direct
accountability at the highest levels of the Federal Government." The Board is specifically tasked to "help tribal colleges: (1) use long-term development, endowment building, and planning to strengthen institutional viability; (2) improve financial management and security, obtain private-sector funding support, and expand and complement Federal education initiatives; (3) develop institutional capacity through the use of new and emerging technologies offered by both the Federal and private sectors; (4) enhance physical infrastructure to facilitate more efficient operation and effective recruitment and retention of students and faculty; and (5) help implement the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 and meet other high standards of educational achievement." The board has historically accomplished these objectives by dividing itself into subcommittees in the fields of (1) education; (2) federal agency relations; and (3) energy, economic development and technology.

## 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Board will consist of not more than 15 members, appointed by the President, who are representatives of tribal colleges and universities or representatives of early childhood, elementary and secondary education, health, business, financial institutions, private foundations, are tribal officials or from other areas the President deems appropriate, such as state elected officials from areas representing Indian tribes or Alaska Natives.

## 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Executive Order 13270 requires the Board meet at least annually, at the request of the Secretary of Education. The Board members are tasked with
providing advice and consultation on tribal colleges and relevant Federal and private-sector activities. The Board has previously hosted discussions with staff from the Secretary's immediate office, Office of Management and Budget and the White House Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to ensure Administration-critical issues have an opportunity to be carried out through developing the capacity at tribal colleges and have an impact on economic development for Indian tribes and Alaska Natives.

## 20d. Why can't the advice or information this

## committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Board will be made up of a diverse group of representatives who will be committed to coming together to share their expertise with the President and Secretary of Education for the benefit of the nation. They will provide valuable advice on strategies for achieving agency compliance with the Executive Order and on ways in which new public-private partnerships and the initiatives can assist this country's tribal colleges and universities in achieving their mission of bringing economic development and higher education to their communities and people. The Board will report annually on agency progress toward achieving the goals of the Executive Order and makes recommendations to the President and Secretary of Education. Without the guidance and expertise from the Board members, federal agencies and potential private sector partners could have great difficulty in prioritizing initiatives, implementing the Executive Order, and assisting tribal colleges in their efforts to create education and economic opportunities for Indian tribes and Alaska Natives.

## 20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings of the President's Board of Advisors on TCUs are open to the public. However, if a meeting must be closed, the Advisory Board will follow procedures as outlined under FACA regulations for operating a closed session.

## Narrative Description

Executive Order 13270 states it is the policy of the Federal Government that this Nation's commitment to educational excellence and opportunity must extend as well to the tribal colleges and universities (tribal colleges) that serve Indian tribes and Alaska Native entities. The President's Board of Advisors on Tribal Colleges and Universities (the Board) and the White House Initiative on Tribal Colleges and Universities (WHITCU) established by this order shall ensure that this national policy regarding tribal colleges is carried out with direct accountability at the highest levels of the Federal Government. EO 13270 requires federal agencies to develop and implement a three-year plan that addresses how they intend to increase the capacity of tribal colleges to compete effectively for any available grants, contacts, cooperative agreements, and any other federal resources. Federal agencies are also required to submit an annual performance report that measures their performance against the objectives set forth in the three-year plan. WHITCU is charged with the responsibility to review the annual performance reports and combine Annual Performance Reports into one annual report, which shall be submitted to the Secretary of Education for review and submitted to the President.
