The No Child Left Behind School Facilities and Construction Negotiated Rulemaking Committee accomplishes its purpose by meeting to prepare reports for the Secretary of the Interior regarding Bureau-funded school facilities.

#### membership?

The Secretary chose from nominations submitted by Indian tribes and others whose students attend Bureau-funded schools (operated either by the Bureau, or by a tribe through a contract or grant). To the maximum extent possible, the proportional representation of tribes on the committee reflects the proportionate share of students from tribes served by the Bureau-funded school facilities. In addition, the Secretary considered the balance of representation with regard to geographical location, size, and type of school and facility, as well as the interests of parents, teachers, administrators, and school board members, in selecting tribal committee representatives.

### 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee prepared their report and submitted it to the Secretary of the Interior. There were no meetings in FY 2012.

### 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The NCLB school facilities negotiated rulemaking committee will prepare and submit to the Secretary of the Interior the following: (1) A catalog of school facilities that includes the components required by 25 U.S.C.  $2005(a)(5)(A)(i)(I)^{C}(V);(2)$  A report that determines the school replacement and new construction needs of the interested parties, and a formula for the equitable distribution of funds to address those needs, based on the requirements of 25 U.S.C. 2005(a)(5)(A)(ii);(3) A report that determines the major and minor renovation needs of the interested parties, and a formula for the equitable distribution of funds to address these needs, based on the requirements of 25 U.S.C. 2005(a)(5)(A)(iii); and(4) Proposed revisions to the national facilities standards for home-living (dormitory) situations, based on the requirements of 25 U.S.C. 2002(a)(1).
