20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Committee assesses both the effectiveness of

existing VA programs and the demand for new initiatives to address the particular needs of OIF/OEF veterans and their families. The Committee makes recommendations on how to tailor VA benefits and services to the needs of this most recent generation of veterans.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Membership of the Committee includes individuals who can express the views of OIF/OEF soldiers, affected families, veterans service organizations, National Guard and Reserve members, relevant medical specialities, and those engaged in transitional assistance activities.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee meets as often as necessary to provide timely advice to the Secretary, usually 3-4 times each year.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom are presenting a variety of challenges that are particular to the current conflicts. Those challenges include appropriate treatment for extraordinarily severe combat injuries, special rehabilitation techniques to address those injuries, the physical and emotional strains of multiple deployments, the social and economic effects of National Guard and Reserve mobilizations, and family financial problems associated with extended periods of hospitalization and/or rehabilitation. Although VA addresses those challenges through its combination programs to deliver veterans benefits and health care there is no office or other entity within VA that is designed

to focus on this collection of issues. Therefore, it has been determined that the guidance to be provided by a panel of independent experts and advocates would greatly assist VA in achieving its goal of addressing the needs of this group of veterans as effectively and efficiently as possible. It is also important to note that no existing VA advisory committee is directed to focus on the special needs of veterans' families.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The Committee's normal operational policy is to hold meetings that are open to the public.

21. Remarks

The Committee completed their two year charter and is being terminated. It was determined that rather than have a single focused committee that their issues could be mainstreamed into the following statutorily chartered committees:

Advisory Committee on the Readjustment of Veterans, Advisory Committee on Prosthetics and Special-Disabialities and Veterans' Advisory Committee on Rehabilitation.
