20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Council meetings provide a public forum through which the identification and recommendation of goals and objectives are made for the work year, and issues and concerns about past or present plans are discussed. The Council held its last meeting October 23, 2008. A final report will be submitted following this meeting.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

As prescribed by the enablng legislation, the Council is not to exceed 35 members appointed by the Secretary of the Interior and composed of (a) the head or a designee of each Federal department or independent agency administering lands through which the trail passes; (b) a member appointed to represent each State through which the trail passes (Alabama), and such appointments are made from recommendations of the Governor(s) of such State(s); and (c) one or more members appointed to represent private organizations, including corporate and individual landowners and land users, which in the opinion of the Secretary have an established and recognized interest in the trail, and such appointments are made from recommendations of the heads of such organizations.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Council generally meets twice a year. Council meetings provide a forum which encourages fairness and understanding, and the atmosphere for group consensus and partnership.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Selma to Montgomery National Historic Trail Advisory Council has been established pursuant to the National Trails System Act to consult with the Secretary of the Interior on the development of a comprehensive plan and other matters relating to the trail, including the selection of rights-of-way, standards for erection, and maintenance of markers. Also, the trail has been designated as an All American Road by the Federal Highway Administration.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings are open.
