There will be as many working groups as necessary to accomplish the goals of the committee.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Board is comprised of no more than twenty-five U.S. citizens, whomthe Secretary appoints. The members may include former senior U.S. government officials and Members of Congress and representatives of corporations, not-for-profit non-government organizations, professional associations, public policy organizations, academic institutions, and other experts in leadership and management issues. The composition of the Committee is balanced in terms of the points of view represented. The Secretary or his or her designee serves as an ex officio member.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?
