Consistent with the requirements of the MINER Act, the membership of the Panel is as follows: 1 member selected for Appointment jointly by the Minority Leaders of the Senate and House of Representatives; 1 member selected for appointment jointly by the majority leaders of the Senate and House of Representatives; 2 members selected for Appointment by the Secretary of Labor and 2 members by the Secretary of Health and Human Services.
