20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Board will provide advice and recommendations on policy and program issues as identified by the U.S. Fire Administrator with the goal of reducing the Nation's fire problem and enhancing emergency management training and program policies, processes and procedures through enhanced research, programs and training to assure the nation's resources are better prepared to prevent, mitigate, respond to and recover from major emergencies or disasters regardless of cause or magnitude. The Board will provide only advice and recommendations on policy and programs as identified by the U.S. Fire Administrator.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Members will be selected their demonstrated professional and personal qualifications, and on their direct and continuing experience with fire and emergency activities and organizations. Advisory Committee members will include representatives for the western, central and eastern portions of the country, state emergency management agencies, fire chiefs' associations, and fire fighters' associations. The Committee membership will be a balanced mix of sponsoring organizations by geographical region, management, and labor.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The National Urban Search and Rescue Response System comprises 28 US&R Task Forces in 19 States, with over 5,000 System Members. Local governments or fire departments sponsor 26 of the Task Forces, State universities sponsor two. A professional staff of five, with two administrative assistants, manages the System at the federal level. Given the size, complexity and diversity of the US&R System, and the small size of the federal staff managing the System, the professional advice, experience, expertise and technical assistance that the Advisory Committee and its advisory organization provide are critical to the overall mission of the System. As experienced and skilled as the FEMA USFA personnel are, they do not have the day-to-day operational contact and range of technical and other experience that the Advisory Committee and its

work groups will bring to the table. The expertise that the Committee and its advisory organization will provide is not available within FEMA or DHS as a whole, and there are no existing committees that provide or could provide the assistance that the Committee will provide. Alternatives such as public hearings or consultant contracts could not provide the continuity or the economy of the present USFA advisory system. USFA desires to utilize the donated, voluntary time of over 300 of the most highly skilled and experienced fire and emergency personnel in the United States on the Advisory Committee and its subcommittees. To replicate their knowledge and experience by paid consultants could cost millions of dollars, if they were available and sought. The Advisory Committee's functions, perspectives and experience are uniquely those of the Sponsoring Organizations and System members (management, labor, and participating agencies) that are professionally involved with USFA. No other existing committee provides those perspectives and experience. No other means, such as a public hearing, can provide the depth and continuity that the Advisory Committee will provide.
