### 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

During its five years of delibrations, the Committee has worked with VA's Education Service to (a) develop requirements for organizations offering certification and licensing tests and (b) ensure that appropriate testing standards were maintained so that VA educational assistance could be paid to

veterans for the costs of those tests. The Committee has recommended that the Secretary propose changes to Public Law 106-419 to define some terms, as used in the section on licensing and certification, and clarify the law, and make it easier for VA to administer the program. The Committee has also recommended that the Licensing and Certification Approval System (LACAS) be improved with funding provided in PL 106-419.

## 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Committee consisted of seven members with expertise in matters relating to licensing and certification tests. The Secretaries of Labor and Defense, or their designees, served as ex-officio members.

## 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee met at least three times per year. The Committee discussed such topics as: State approving agency's approval of licensing and certification tests for VA purposes; VA's Education Service marketing and outreach plan, increasing usage through outreach; quality assurance process and regulation; and the intent of legislation allowing VA to pay benefits for taking approved licensing and certification tests.

### 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This Committee was established in compliance with section 3689 of Title 38, U.S.C. The advice provided by the Committee was during implementation of the licensing and certification reimbursement program because VA's experience in educational assistance had been focused on

more traditional academic pursuits rather than curricula that lead to professional licenses or certifications.

## 20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings were open to the public.

#### 21. Remarks

Public Law 109-461 created a demonstration project (to be managed by the Labor Department) to match military occupational specialties to civilian jobs that require certification and/or licensure. The law calls for coordination between DoD, VA, state employment agencies and state licensure/certification groups. That measure would also create a task force to monitor the project, and it is expected that membership on the task force would demand the same expertise that current Committee members have. That leaves open the possibility that Committee members could serve on the task force.
