20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Secretary established the Board in April 2005 to assist the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) in improving the management of its facility construction process, by assessing the Department's current procedures on design approval, procurement and administration of construction contracts, quality assurance, construction project management, and disposition of excess VA facilities. The Chair of the Board divided up the areas of interest among three teams. The first team was charged with looking at organization and structure, a second was charged with evaluating programming of projects, design approval and planning, and the third team was assigned to investigate project execution, contract management and quality.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Membership of the Board ensures that all affected disciplines are represented. Those disciplines and areas of professional expertise include procurement policy, architecture, construction management, design and function of major medical facilities, engineering, and contract dispute resolution.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee held two meetings.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Secretary determined that the Board was both in the public interest and essential to the conduct of VA business. Most of the Board's work focused on the construction and management of VA medical facilities which are essential to VA's mission of delivering health care to our nation's veterans. By implementing improved processes based upon the Board's recommendations, VA will be better equipped to deliver higher quality health care more efficiently in facilities that are tailored to the special needs of the patient population. The duties and functions of the Board cannot be duplicated within VA. The Board was composed of experts within the commercial construction and development industries, will provide a body of expertise and qualifications that VA does not now have. During its deliberations, the Board applied private sector best practices to VA's current processes and procedures.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The Board discussed personnel issues in closed session to honor the privacy of any individual VA employees being affected by the Board's work.
