The Independent Panel will review the impact of Hurricane Katrina on the telecommunications and media infrastructure and make recommendations on ways to improve disaster preparedness, network reliability, and communication among first responders. The Independent Panel will gather data and information necessary to formulate recommendations for assuring optimal communications services during Hurricanes and other natural disasters.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

A balanced membership will be selected comprised of individuals from public safety organizations, as well as individuals from the public and private telecommunications sectors.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

In the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, it became apparent that a review was necessary to determine how communications services can be improved to increase effectiveness and to minimize disruptions. An Independent FACA Panel presents the most optimum forum from which recommendations can be formulated to improving telecommunications services during natural disasters.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

21. Remarks

Because of the urgency of the upcoming Hurricane season, which commences in July 2006, the Independent Panel will present their recommendations no later than June 15, 2006 so that many of the recommendations can be implemented before the start of the 2006 Hurricane season. As a result, we request that the 15-day waiting period (for establishing new committees) be waived before filing the charter with Congressional officials and the Library of Congress.
