The members of the Scientific Advisory Board represent distinguished scientists of the highest order in the broad range of the 29 registries of pathology. The members are drawn from throughout the country, from the medical academic community, from staff of prominent private and public hospitals, and from the federal sector. In addition, top military researchers from each of the services are included to ensure military-relevant problems are discussed.
