The Advisory Committee advises the Secretary on programs and policies to advance the use of cultural diplomacy in United States foreign policy. The Advisory Committee, in particular, provides advice to the Secretary of State on: 1) increasing the presentations abroad of the finest of the creative, visual, and performing arts of the United States; and 2) strategies for increasing public-private partnerships to sponsor cultural exchange programs that promote the national interests of the United States.

## 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Members are appointed by the Secretary of State who are reconized as distinguished Americans with a demonstrated record of achievement in the creative, visual and performing arts, or international affairs. The membership is comprised of not more than four from the same political party.

# 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Advisory Committee meets at least twice each year or as frequently as may be necessary to carry out its duties.

## 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This committee is established by legislation (PL 107-228) and is necessary to provide advice to the Secretary of State on means to increase the presentations abroad of the finest of the creative, visual, and performing arts of the United States and on strategies for increasing public-private partnerships to sponsor cultural exchange programs that promote the national interests of the United States.
